Gift Aid Giving

If you are a UK taxpayer you can boost your donation by 25p of Gift Aid for every £1 you donate. Gift Aid can be reclaimed by the Trust from the tax you pay for the current tax year. Your address is needed to identify you as a current UK taxpayer.

The declaration covers gifts made in any way – standing order, cheque, cash or bank transfer – so long as we know you made the gift. So, for cash gifts you need to put them in an envelope with your name on. For bank transfers put your name as the reference.

Please notify the Lifeboat Trust if you:

1. Want to cancel this declaration.
2. Change your name or home address.
3. No longer pay sufficient tax on your income and/or capital gains.
If so you must cancel or reduce your Declaration.

If you don't you will become liable for the tax inappropriately recovered by the Trust and HMRC may seek to recover the difference directly from you (not the Trust or other charity).

If you pay income tax at the higher or additional rate and want to receive the additional tax relief due to you, you must include all your Gift Aid donations on your Self Assessment tax return or ask HM Revenue & Customs to adjust your tax code.
