Keith graduated from Cambridge University in 1977 with a degree in Natural Sciences, taking Biochemistry in his final year. He stayed in Cambridge and studied for a PhD in the department of Pharmacology, where he also did several years' post-doctoral work. He was appointed to a lectureship in Pharmacology in the University of Southampton in 1987, where he held a Lister Institute Research Fellowship from 1989-1994. He became professor of Biochemistry in 2000. He has held several positions of leadership within the School of Biological Sciences in Southampton University and is presently programme manager for the Biochemistry and Pharmacology degrees. His research interests concern the sequence specific recognition of DNA by small molecules, oligonucleotides and proteins, as well as the formation of unusual DNA structures. He has published over 180 papers in this field of research.

Keith is Senior Executive Editor of *Nucleic Acids Research* and is a member of the Biochemical Society and the American Chemical Society.

Keith is chair of [Christians in Science](#) and is a lay reader in the Church of England. He attends [Highfield Church](#) in Southampton, where he is a homegroup leader and a regular preacher.

From September he is a tutor co-ordinating the mission based training programme for the Church Army. He taught the sciences for more than 30 years in the UK, India and Nepal. His biology doctorate was an historical, philosophical and scientific analysis of models of origins, which examined the central role of metaphysical commitments in science. He authored *Science in Faith: a Christian perspective on teaching science* (1998).



Dr John Peet

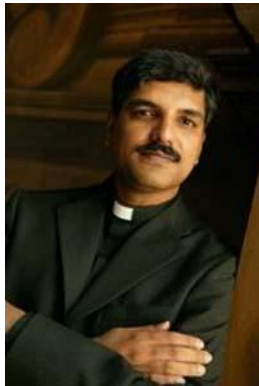
BSc, MSc, PhD, FRSC

Jules read English Literature at the University of Bombay and went on to pursue a career in journalism-where he campaigned for social justice and against corruption. His desire to dovetail the gospel with social transformation led him to study theology at the Union Biblical Seminary, Pune and the United Theological College, Bangalore, where after completing his Masters he joined the faculty as Lecturer in Biblical Studies. He earned his PhD from the University of Cambridge.

Jules is the MA Course Leader and a lecturer in Biblical Theology at [London School of Theology](#). He is also an ordained Anglican minister and has served as a pastor both in India and England. He is a regular speaker at retreats, conferences and in churches ranging from Syrian Orthodox to charismatic and has been a regular contributor to BBC Radio Cambridgeshire. Until recently he was Co-ordinating Chaplain to the University of Greenwich, Trinity College of Music and the Old Royal Naval College Chapel, where he enjoyed a thriving ministry among staff, students and young urban professionals. He is the author of five books and a number of articles. For over 20 years he has endeavoured in every aspect of his ministry to teach and apply the whole of the Bible to contemporary issues. In addition to his academic interests, he is particularly passionate about how the Old Testament can be used in the ministry of the Church and in the wider world.
